It follows a multidimensional approach and imbibes listening, speaking, reading, and writing techniques to boost communication abilities among students. This program is highly interactive, where students participate in individual and group activities. Students are introduced to native speakers' accents through various videos that improve their pronunciation, accent, and intonation. 1:20 faculty-student ratio is maintained to establish rapport and hone the students' skills in an ambience that is conducive and amicable for their all-round development.

Description: Students are given ample exercises on writing and reading tasks following the lines of IELTS or the company's requirements, preparing them for higher studies. To improve writing skills, tasks like visual interpretation, Role-Plays, describing a process, a person, or an event, etc. are given. Students read a given text and answer questions, analyze, and interpret the text. This improves logical and analytical skills.



TALENT QUEST

A Special Program

A special program by Fly High students was organized in order to boost the students' confidence and enthusiasm. All the students of Fly High Group, faculty of English, HOD BS&H, Section Head, English, President, Secretary, and Technical Director attended the program. The main motto of this program is to make students entertain an audience through their performance in a program meant to showcase their language skills without using their mother tongue.
