Policy Document for Code Of Ethics

- Students should bring their own calculators, drawing instruments, charts, data book etc., whenever needed.
- Students are expected to take care of their belongings.
- 8. Students are instructed not to bring any valuable items to college.
- Usage of mobile/camera or other electronic gadgets inside the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- 10. Chewing bubblegum, chocolate inside the class room during lecture hour is not allowed.
- Students should wear their own lab coats and bring observation note books to the laboratory classes regularly.
- 12. Adhere to campus Anti-ragging norms
- Be sensitive to gender issues and societal needs.
- 14. Students are expected to be courteous by greeting the staff members when they meet them in the campus.
- 15. Students should attend functions and meetings and are expected to take part in extracurricular activities conducted by the college.

- Faculty members shall uphold the highest standards of integrity, honesty, and academic rigor in all their professional activities, including teaching, research, and administrative duties.
- Faculty members shall treat all students, colleagues, and staff with respect, fairness, and dignity, regardless of their race, ethnicity, gender, religion, or other personal characteristics.

- 5. Promote inclusivity in the classroom and create an environment where all students feel welcome valued.
- 6. Faculty shall fulfil their professional responsibilities, including timely grading, availability for student consultation, and active participation in departmental activities.

- 8. Faculty engaged in research shall adhere to ethical research standards, including honesty, transparency, and adherence to applicable rules and regulations.
- 9. Disclose any potential conflicts of interest related to research activities.
- 10. Faculty members shall maintain the confidentiality of student and institutional information in accordance with applicable laws and policies.
- Confidential student records shall be accessed and shared in compliance with institutional policies.
- 12. Faculty members shall have the academic freedom to express their opinions and ideas, provided they do so within the framework of their professional expertise and in a manner that does not harm the institution or its stakeholders.
- 13. Faculty members shall report any violations of this code of ethics by colleagues or students to the appropriate authorities within the institution.
- 14 Faculty members shall comply with all relevant laws and regulations governing their profession and the operation of the institution.
- 15. Faculty members shall engage in continuous professional development to stay current with developments in their fields and teaching methods.

Code of Ethics for NonTeaching / Supporting Faculty:

- 1. Non-teaching faculty/supporting staff shall be committed to the institutional mission and objectives, working collaboratively to support the college's educational goals and values.
- 2. Non-teaching faculty and staff members shall treat all students, colleagues, and peers with respect, fairness, and dignity, regardless of their background, characteristics, or positions within the institution.
- 3. Staff members shall use institutional resources responsibly and efficiently, including time, equipment, and supplies.
- Safeguard institutional property and resources against theft, misuse, or damage.
- 5. Collaborate effectively with colleagues and faculty members to support the educational and administrative functions of the college.
